Learning

We have made some minor changes to the way we plan for learning in the nursery. Planning is still built around the children's interests however our planning will change more frequently to reflect our children's evolving interests. Staff use observations during play activities and also conversations with children to plan future learning experiences. If your child shows interest at home in a particular subject, please upload a picture on Learning Journals so staff can talk to your child and use this as a learning opportunity. Proud Cloud

Thank you to all families who are engaging in our Proud Cloud initiative. This is an excellent opportunity for our children to achieve and progress their skills, particularly independence. Can Proud Cloud booklets please be returned on a Thursday or a Friday each week so they can be reissued on a Monday. Also, a reminder that it is just one achievement per week maximum and some achievements might take more than one week to complete. It is important your child achieves their target consistently. Early Years A-Z of attachment and resilience

We hope you found the information in December's Newsletter useful. This document is produced by South Lanarkshire Council Psychological Service and is designed to support parents/carers. Within each newsletter we will explain 2 or 3 letters of the A-Z. Should you wish further advice or support on any aspect please speak to Mrs Phin or a member of staff.

<u>D is for Developing Self Control-</u>children find it difficult to control their behaviour in the way adults can. By helping children to develop self control we can help them manage and respond to their feelings, impulses and needs in the future. Try to recognise and name your child's emotions to help them build up a language for feelings. Allow your child to make choices that are age appropriate and encourage games that teach waiting and turn taking.

<u>E is for Enriched environment-</u> Providing your child with an environment that has lots of stimultion can activate an appetite for life, curiosity, drive and motivation. Encourage play that stimulates imagination. Try choosing toys such as little people, animals or transport. Alternatively encourage creative play with natural materials such as sand and water.

<u>F is for Feelings-</u> Helping children with big feelings early on can impact on how they handle stress later in life. By helping your child describe how they feel you can help them successfully manage feelings when things are difficult in the future. Try naming feelings for your child e.g. "you look upset, has something happened?" and matching your tone to how your child is feeling i.e. if they are happy use a happy voice. This lets them know that you are listening to them.

Primary One Enrolment

The enrolment process for children due to start school in August 2023 will be online through South Lanarkshire's website week beginning 9th January 2023. Once the application has been received a member of staff will contact you week beg 16th January 2023 to discuss the registration. Please see the website for full details. You will need your child's full birth certificate and two proofs of address for the online registration.

Parents who are unable to complete an online registration form due to technology issues or their property is not listed on the mapping system can complete a Reg1 document with Mrs Johnston, or ladies from the office. You must however provide the full birth certificate and necessary proofs of residence by email or post.

If you wish to defer a decision to start school, please approach your current nursery establishment to discuss and complete a deferred entry application. *The closing date for applications is 31 January 2023.*

Enrolment for Nursery

Applications for nursery close on the last day in February each year, If you know of anyone who has a child who will be 3 years old between March 2023 and the last day in February 2024 please submit your application via the SLC website.
