Covid 19

Whilst Covid 19 is on the decline we wish to do everything to ensure our pupils and staff are well. Public health messages for schools Public Health Scotland and the Scottish Government want to take the opportunity to reiterate the core public health messages for schools in Scotland:

- Washing hands thoroughly using soap and water will help prevent the spread of common infections such as colds, flu, COVID-19, threadworms, and stomach bugs. Hands should be washed throughout the day, e.g., before and after eating; after using the toilet; after coughing or sneezing; and when returning from breaks.
- Adults including staff, volunteers and parents visiting settings, should stay at home and avoid contact with other people if they have symptoms of a respiratory infection



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such as coronavirus and they: have a high temperature or do not feel well enough to go to work or carry out normal activities.

- They should do this until they no longer have a high temperature (if they had one) or until they feel better.
- Children who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people, where they can. They can go back to school, college, or childcare, and resume normal activities when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend.
